
9. Oil Control Solenoid


A: REMOVAL

1. INTAKE SIDE


1) Disconnect the ground cable from battery.



- 2) Remove the air intake duct. (RH side only) <Ref. to IN(H4DO)-13, REMOVAL, Air Intake Duct.>
- 3) Remove the reservoir tank. (LH side only) < Ref. to CO(H4DO)-51, REMOVAL, Reservoir Tank.>
- 4) Disconnect the connector (A) from the oil control solenoid, and remove the oil control solenoid from the chain cover.




2. EXHAUST SIDE

1) Disconnect the ground cable from battery.




- 2) Remove the air intake duct. (RH side only) <Ref. to IN(H4DO)-13, REMOVAL, Air Intake Duct.>
- 3) Remove the reservoir tank. (LH side only) <Ref. to CO(H4DO)-51, REMOVAL, Reservoir Tank.>

- 4) Disconnect the connector (A) from the oil control solenoid, and remove the oil control solenoid from the chain cover.

B: INSTALLATION

Install in the reverse order of removal.

NOTE:


Use new O-rings.

Tightening torque:

6.4 N·m (0.7 kgf-m, 4.7 ft-lb)

C: INSPECTION

- 1) Check that the oil control solenoid has no deformation, cracks or other damages. 2) Measure the resistance between the oil control solenoid terminals.



Terminal No.	Standard
1 and 2	7.25±0.4 Ω (when 20°C (68°F))
